HOLE #1

A well placed drive will give you a chance to go for it in two on this reachable par five. Choose to lay up and you are left with a short iron approach to a big green. Miss the green to the left and you're left with a touchy pitch shot.

HOLE #2

Hole 2 is the first of 4 holes in a row with an "O.B." to your right side. With a green that slopes severely from back to front, hole 2 can be deceivingly tough. Teeing off into the prevailing south wind can call for a long iron. Walk away with a par and you're a happy golfer on this hole.

HOLE #3

With a good drive, this short par 4 gives you another good opportunity for a birdie. "Big Hitters" will clear the road and be left with a short pitch into the green. For the rest, a short iron and a putt on a relatively flat green and you have a birdie. Watch out though for "out of bounds on your right!"

HOLE #4

With "out of bounds" on the right, and water on the left, Hole 4 has been rated as one of Nebraska's toughest par 4's. A blind second shot makes this hole even harder. Get through this hole with little trouble, and you can breathe a big sigh of relief!

HOLE #5

A scenic par 3 that demands a good tee shot to this very large green. A bunker on the right and a side hill on the left, make this hole a tough par 3. Occasionally you can get a friendly bounce off the side hill onto the green. Missing short give you the best opportunity for a chip and a putt.

HOLE #6

A lot of elevation change on this tricky par 4 dogleg left. A blind tee shot adds to the difficulty. It's important to hit your approach to the appropriate tier of this two tiered green. Putting from the wrong tier is NO FUN!

HOLE #7

A beautiful hole that uses the natural slope of the terrain. Guess what? Another blind tee shot! Hit your tee shot just right and you can end up in the perfect position as the ball can bounce around the dogleg right. Big hitters can cut the dogleg for an easier chance at a birdie. BUT it's a risk/reward decision as you hit directly over several trees. There is not as much break in this green as there may appear.

HOLE #8

A dominant south wind makes this straight away par 4 a tough one. Approach shots can range from short irons to using a fairway wood depending on the conditions. This hole has probably the most difficult green to putt on, as it features a lot of break. Par on this hole, and you should be smiling.

HOLE #9

A short par 4 gives you a chance to finish strong. Be sure to check your alignment with your tee shot. The box tends to point you out of bounds on the left. Subtle breaks in this green can be deceiving.
